CARTAGENA OVERVIEW

Colombia was originally populated by the Chibchas Indians, who lived in the mountains of Colombia long before the Americas were discovered. The Chibchas were an advanced civilization who are now referred to as "Pre-Columbians" (before Christopher Columbus). The Indians were excellent goldsmiths and miners. Unfortunately, this was their downfall, since the explorers plundered the Indians for their emeralds and gold.

Cartagena itself was founded in 1533 by Don Pedro de Heredia. Throughout the 16th Century, Spain governed it through a system of Viceroys. When the Spanish conquistadors discovered that the interior of Colombia was rich in gold and emeralds, wealth of all kinds flowed from Cartagena for shipment to Spain. This fortune soon invited pirate attacks. In defense of the city, King Felipe II ordered a protective wall be built around the city. Streets of the city were intentionally made narrow and crooked, designed for protection during assault.

Cartagena was victim to 5 sieges during the 16th Century, the most famous being led by Sir Francis Drake in 1586. Drake made it into the Cartagena harbor, but accepted a 10 million-peso ransom for not burning the city. When the wall was completed in 1686 (50ft thick!), Spain had spent 59 million ounces of gold to protect Cartagena. But this turned out to be a good investment. When England attacked again in 1741, with 24,000 men and 186 ships, Cartagena successfully defended itself.

November 11, the anniversary of the city's declaration of independence from Spain, is the city's principal celebration. On this day, the population parades through the streets in fancy dress costumes and masks. Today, Cartagena's wealth is still centered around emeralds, plus platinum, oil and timber. And let's not forget coffee. Cartagena may have been a defensive city in the past, but it now warmly and generously welcomes all its visitors and guarantees them a wonderful time.


