As you watch the preshow to the Tower of Terror, notice that the little girl is carrying a Mickey doll.

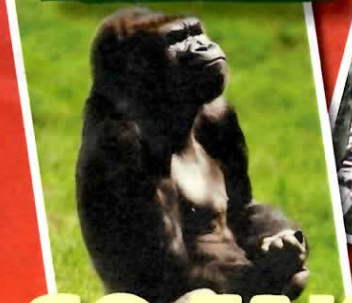
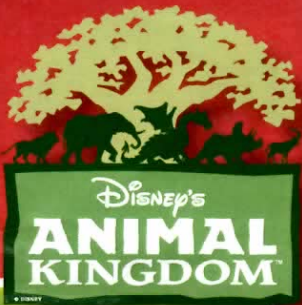
As you are about to leave Gangster Alley on the Great Movie Ride, look up and back at some warehouse windows to see Mickey's shadow in the corner.

On the Streets of America, look at the San Francisco mural. Look at the news stand and check out the stack of papers. There's an article about 'Steamboat Willie' and a picture to match.

On the *Rock'n'Roller Coaster*® Starring Aerosmith, each limo has a Hidden Mickey on the license plate where the year goes.

Visit Pizza Planet Arcade and look at the mural above the arcade games. You'll spot Mickey facing left in the moon near the top.





GO TAKE A HIKE!

At Disney's Animal Kingdom, the rides aren't the only attractions. There are several trails that you can explore to see strange, exotic and wonderful creatures from all over the world. Visit Pangani Forest Exploration Trail near Harambe Village to come face to face with a gorilla, or explore the palace ruins of Maharajah Jungle Trek where tigers roam among the rubble.

FUN FACTS

Disney's Animal Kingdom is the largest of the Disney Parks and covers over 500 acres. It's large enough to fit the Magic Kingdom, Epcot and Disney's Hollywood Studios inside and still have a bit of room left!

There are 325 animals carved into the Tree of Life at the center of the park. You'll have to visit Discovery Island and walk all the trails all around the tree if you want to see them all!

On the Dinosaur ride, the large, carnivore that chases your vehicle is not a Tyrannosaurus Rex. It's actually a Carnotaurus, which was a more recently discovered meat-eater.

The Tree of Life stands an impressive 145 feet tall and is covered with 203,000 semi-transparent leaves that actually blow in the wind!

On the back of the Tree of Life, look for the hippo, and then look for the moss spot on his forehead.

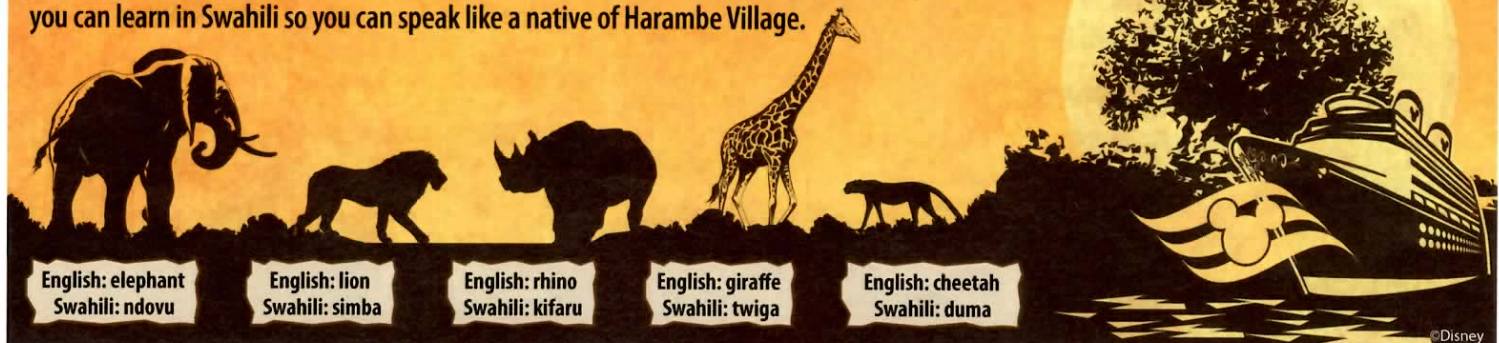
In Harambe Village, on your way to the safari, look at the drains in the ground outside the shop. You'll find one there.

The Magic Kingdom Park has been open for over 40 years and there's no doubt that it's been visited by more people than any other theme park. It's been called the place where "Dreams Come True", so what are you dreaming about today? As you travel the 7 themed lands, you're bound to experience some of that same magic that has touched millions of people for years.

MAGIC KINGDOM FUN FACTS

The Walt Disney World Railroad are all authentic steam-powered trains dating back to the early 1900's.

The design for Main Street was inspired by Walt Disney's memories of his hometown of Marceline, Missouri.

Splash Mountain features a 5-story plunge at a 45 degree angle and reaches a speed of 40 miles per hour!

There's a part of the park you'll never see... because it's all underground. Below the park are tunnels, cafeterias, offices and service areas that are for Cast Members only.

The Magic Kingdom Park opened in 1971. Although Walt Disney did survey the property, he died before the park construction was completed.

HIDDEN MICKEY'S

In the Haunted Mansion, as you pass through the ballroom, look at the left end of the table. You may see 3 plates that are arranged in a familiar way (if the ghosts haven't disturbed them, that is).

On Buzz Lightyear's Space Ranger Spin, look at the murals. In one image of 'Sector 1', there's a continent shaped like Mickey's head.

As you sit in Mickey's Philharmagic, look at the French horn. You'll see a Mickey in the pipes.

Go to the Agrabah Bazaar in Adventureland. Look for a white necklace that is embedded in the cement. Not far away, you'll find the charm with a hidden Mickey on it.

In the lobby of the Hall of Presidents, look for the painting of George Washington. At the tip of his sword, you'll see a golden Mickey.





BE A WORLD TRAVELER!

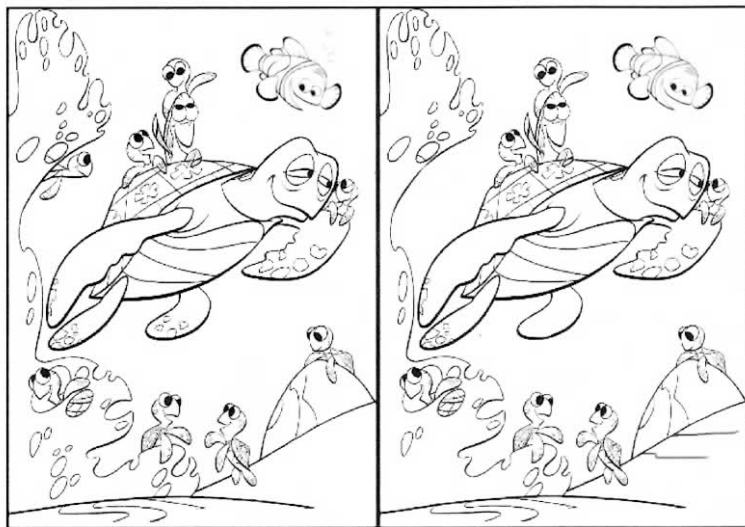

DID YOU KNOW?

Epcot is actually an acronym (*initials that form a word*) for *Experimental Prototype Community of Tomorrow* and was the first theme part that Walt Disney wanted to put in Florida.

At the Imagination Pavilion, there's a waterfall where the water flows upwards and fountains where the water leaps from area to area.

There are 11 countries represented in the World Showcase Lagoon. They are Mexico, Norway, China, Germany, Italy, America, Japan, Morocco, France, United Kingdom, and Canada.

Epcot opened in 1982 and actually features 2 distinct areas. Future World is at the front where you can explore the wonders of technology and the World Showcase Lagoon where you can travel from country to country without a passport!

HIDDEN MICKEY'S

If you plan to take flight on Soarin', you'll want to pay attention during the preshow. As the pilot removes his hat, he's actually taking off Mickey ears!

The Seas with Nemo and Friends has a Hidden Mickey that you have to work to find. Go to the upper level and look down from the 4th window on the right. At the bottom of the tank, you'll see it.

There are 2 in the mural as you wait in the queue in Norway's Maelstrom. Look for a Viking wearing Mickey Ears in a boat is one and at the face of a workers' watch is the other. Can you find them?

There are many others that appear from time to time as attractions change. Ask a Cast Member at any attraction to see if you can find others.
