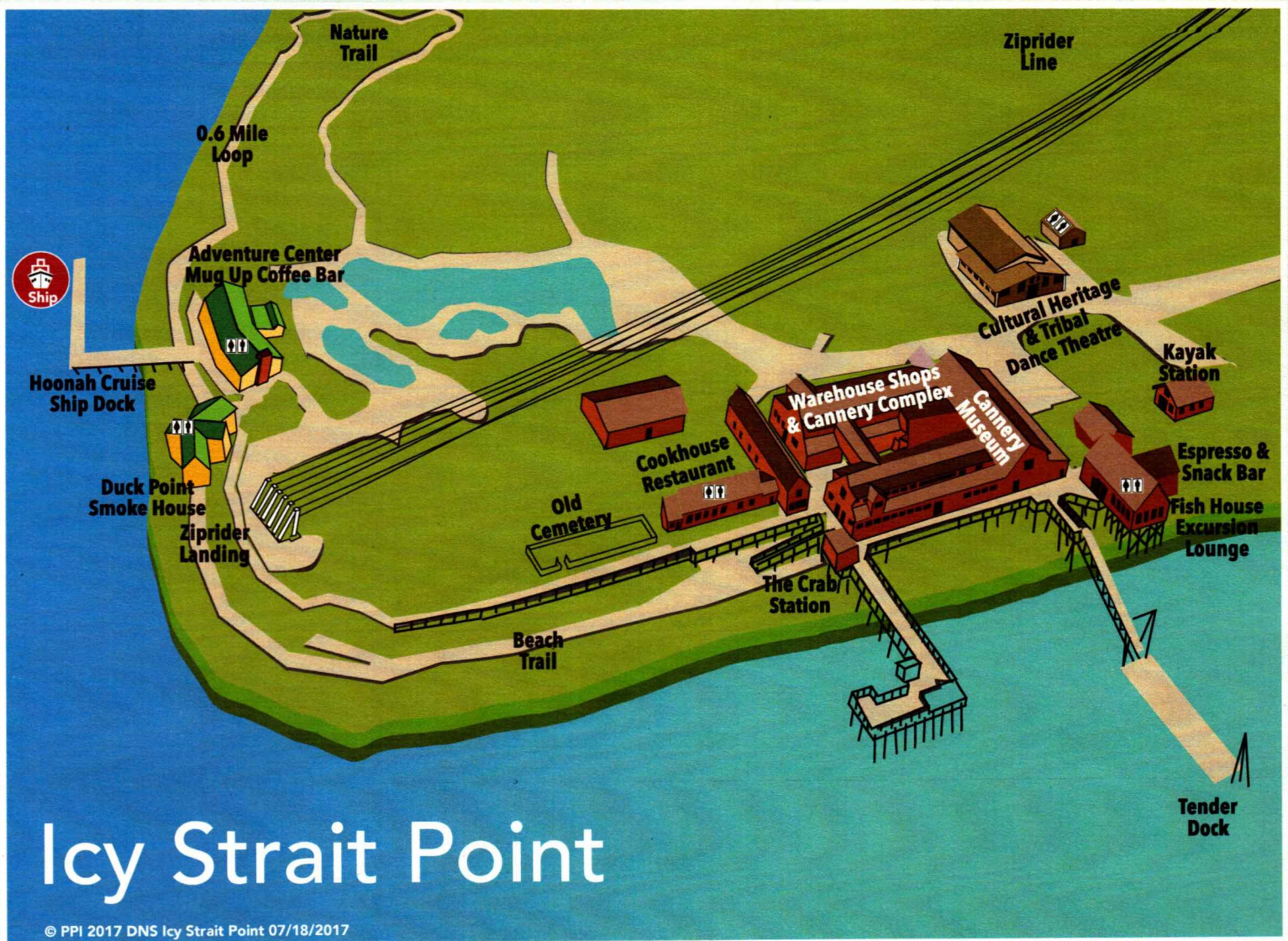

### SAFETY ASHORE INFORMATION

While you will find many great experiences ashore, please remain vigilant about your personal safety and the safety of your belongings. As in any large urban tourist destination, you'll want to take some basic precautions to make the most of your time ashore.

- Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Avoid short cuts, narrow alleys and poorly lit streets.
- Avoid wandering from the main shopping and tourist areas into unfamiliar territory. If venturing out independently, have a plan, use only licensed taxi operators.
- Identity/Credit Card theft can occur anywhere. Please remain vigilant in monitoring the safe keeping of your personal information.
- Leave valuables in your room safe and avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Exercise caution when using ATMs. Cameras and handbags should be carried close to your body or concealed out of sight.
- Leave air transportation tickets and other travel documents in your room safe. When going ashore, each adult is required to carry a Driver's license, passport or other government-issued photo ID. – Note: Some ports may require Guests to carry passports ashore.
- Most crimes are easier to commit in dark unlit areas. When going ashore at night, please be extra vigilant about your personal safety.

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## ICY STRAIT POINT OVERVIEW

Icy Strait Point is located on Chichagof Island in the town of Hoonah, Alaska (35 miles west of Juneau) and is owned and operated by Huna Totem Corporation with its shareholders comprising an overwhelming majority of the workforce. Accordingly you can be sure that when you are in ISP the people you meet know the authentic stories and history.

Icy Strait Point caters to cruise ship guests and offers a private port for those traveling on major cruise lines. When you visit this historical town, once home to the fishing cannery industry, there's a multitude of excursions, dining options and locally owned stores. The people of ISP are dedicated to providing a one-of-a-kind experience for each visitor by sharing Alaska's natural beauty and native culture. For over 10,000 years, the Tlingit's have lived and thrived in Southeast Alaska. Access to abundant resources on both land and sea has enabled the Tlingit people to develop a rich culture and complex social structure. That structure and culture has survived the ages and is still evident today. The ability of its people to

adapt to an ever-changing environment and to maintain cultural ties to the land and sea are at the core of its very existence. Each family had a dwelling that could house up to 30 family members with its own identification and clan symbols. Many villages had a large communal building that would serve as a gathering place for ceremonies and other clan or tribal meetings. Childrearing had been everyone's responsibility with aunts, uncles or grandparents typically taking a stronger role than the parents. This system helped to insure that children would be properly trained and better able to survive in an unforgiving environment. When visiting Icy Strait Point, guests will be introduced to Tlingit history through song, dance and storytelling – the same way Alaska natives have learned for generations.

Icy Strait Point is located right around the corner from Point Adolphus, one of the world's premier whale watching destinations. Scores of whales make this their home for the summer and viewing are guaranteed on every whale watch tour!
