Safety Ashore Information

While you will find many great experiences ashore, please remain vigilant about your personal safety and the safety of your belongings. As in any large urban tourist destination, you'll want to take some basic precautions to make the most of your time ashore.

- Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Avoid short cuts, narrow alleys and poorly lit streets.
- Avoid wandering from the main shopping and tourist areas into unfamiliar territory. If venturing out independently, have a plan, use only licensed taxi operators.
- Identity/Credit Card theft can occur anywhere. Please remain vigilant in monitoring the safe keeping of your personal information.
- Leave valuables in your room safe and avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Exercise caution when using ATMs. Cameras and handbags should be carried close to your body or concealed out of sight.
- Leave air transportation tickets and other travel documents in your room safe. When going ashore, each adult is required to carry a Driver's license, passport or other government-issued photo ID. – Note: Some ports may require guests to carry passports ashore.
- Most crimes are easier to commit in dark unlit areas. When going ashore at night, please be extra vigilant about your personal safety.

NEW YORK CITY OVERVIEW

New York City is composed of five boroughs, each with its own history and each with its own beauty. The boroughs of Manhattan, Brooklyn, Staten Island, the Bronx, and Queens have made it a metropolis. Bridges, subways, buses and cabs have all developed into making New York the city it is today.

New York has always been considered the "heart of America." Immigrants have always felt welcomed and have developed major neighborhoods throughout the city. One can be at home in Little Italy, Chinatown, Germantown, etc. Every piece of the world is in New York City. Restaurants and boutiques sprout on every street; tourists New York always feel welcomed and are always amazed at the structures, bridges, and underground of New York City.

History lovers will want to visit Ellis Island, through which 12 million immigrants entered the country between 1892 and 1954, and the Statue of Liberty on Liberty Island. Other classic New York landmarks include the Empire State Building and the Chrysler Building. Both offer magnificent views of the city. At the United Nations, you can see council chambers, the General Assembly Hall, and various exhibits.

The downtown South Street Seaport is a bustling waterfront community with a maritime museum, beautiful views, and more than 100 shops and restaurants. You'll also find unique stores, galleries, restaurants, and cafes in SoHo and Greenwich Village. Shoppers will want to stroll along the upscale Fifth and Madison avenues, home to scores of well-known designer stores, including Saks Fifth Avenue and Tiffany & Co. Or you can stroll or ride a bike in Central Park, with its 834 acres of landscaped and recreational areas. Things to do in the park are endless, including a zoo, carousel, skating rink, theater, lake, gardens, food, walking and biking tours, and all sorts of entertainment.

New York is packed with world-class restaurants, so it's impossible to go hungry here. Grab a bite at the Carnegie Deli, famous for its mile-high deli sandwiches, or at Carmine's, known for its tasty Italian menu served in hearty family-style portions.
