KRISTIANSAND OVERVIEW

Norway's fifth largest city, Kristiansand is a favorite summer holiday destination for Norwegians. Nicknamed "The Pearl of the South" thanks to its in town beach and numerous sunny days this historic city is also a favorite with visitors.

Kristiansand dates back to 1641 when it was founded by King Christian IV as a market town. It was nearly two centuries later before the city would be formally declared a municipality. Today Kristiansand remains an economic capital for southern Norway and thanks to its excellent transportation links, the country's second largest harbor with a diversified economy that includes industry and tourism. The historic town square is arranged in a Renaissance style called Kvadraturen, with a square grid of streets. Today this town center is filled with shops and stalls; the four quarters of the city are each just a short distance from this center.

Near the city center, the Kristiansand Cathedral is easily identified with its tall, sage green steeple. It seats 1800 worshipers and is one of the largest churches in the country. Visitors can climb the spire for a spectacular view of the city.

One of the city's top attractions is the Kristiansand Dyreparken or Zoo, located about five miles from the city center. The most visited attraction in Norway, the 150-acre zoo is home to a wide variety of animals ranging from include wolves and lynxes to zebras and orangutans. The zoo includes a swimming area with heated pools.

Another top sight is the Vest-Agder County Museum, one of the largest open-air museums in Norway. Here 40 historic homes and structures are arranged in farmyards and in a recreation of an old city street, all using homes moved from the historic city center.

Natural history takes center stage at the city's Agder Museum of Natural History and Botanical Gardens. Built in 1828, this garden is one of Norway's oldest natural history museums with displays that range from minerals to the Ice Age.

On nice summer days one of the top activities is a visit to the Fish Market. Lined with maritime-inspired structures, the market is located on the Gravanekanalen or the Gravane Canal. Here sightseeing boats ply the waters while visitors and locals alike enjoy sidewalk cafes and a bustling atmosphere.

Shopping:

Most of the stores can be found on Markens Gate which is a pedestrianized street.

Docking/Anchorage:

The Ship will dock at main pier, less than 0.5 mile to the town center.
