Travel Safety Tips

As in any tourist destination, you will want to take some basic precautions to make the most of your time ashore.

- Be aware of your surroundings, especially in crowded areas.
- Avoid wandering from the main shopping and tourist areas into unfamiliar territory. If venturing out independently, have a plan, use only licensed taxi operators.
- Leave your valuables in your stateroom safe and avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Exercise caution when using ATMs.
- Cameras and handbags should be carried close to your body or concealed out of sight. People who carry handbags or backpacks are particularly vulnerable to purse snatchers on scooters.
- When going ashore, each adult and child is required to carry a passport or other government-issued photo ID. – Note: Some ports may require Guests to carry passports ashore.
- In general, use the same level of precaution you would use in any tourist destination.

Please remember that while in a foreign country, you are subject to its laws.



STOCKHOLM OVERVIEW

Stockholm, the capital of Sweden, is a progressive city. Set at the point where the waters of Malaren (Lake Malar) rush into the Baltic, Stockholm is one of Europe's most beautiful capitals. Nearly 1.5 million people live in the greater Stockholm area, yet it remains a quiet, almost pastoral city. Built on 14 small islands among open bays and narrow channels, the city is handsome and civilized. It is filled with parks that cover nearly a third of the entire city, and with squares and airy boulevards, yet it's also a bustling metropolis. Glass and steel skyscrapers abound but you are never more than five minutes walk from twisting medieval streets and waterside promenades.

The city enjoys a bustling street life with a high density of restaurants, a thriving café society and free entertainment in parks and gardens that contribute to an exciting and colorful outdoor life in the summer. Stockholm is also rich in cultural activities, with a wide selection of museums, theaters, art galleries and churches. Gamla Stan, situated on the island of Stadsholmen, is Stockholm's old medieval town that emerged in the 13th century. Gamla Stan is home to the present Royal Palace, where apartments and an armory offer an excellent insight into the past. A ceremonial changing of the guard takes place at noon on weekdays. The Royal Palace is one of the largest inhabited royal castles in the world. It contains 680 rooms and is still in use. It is recommended to wander through the many museums that are located within the palace. There are the Royal Apartments, the Royal Armoury, the Royal Treasury and the Museum of Antiquities. The oldest city wall (1250), a simple stonewall which gave the city its characteristic shape of a heart, can also be seen there.

East of the city, the larger island of Djurgården offers wonderful parklands and a concentration of fine museums. On the western shore of Djurgården is the famous Vasamuseet, which grants you a look into the lives of 17th-century sailors and is a brilliant achievement in marine archaeology. Storkyrkan located in the oldest quarter in the city, this cathedral was built in 1279. It is used for royal weddings, baptisms and coronations, and can be visited by the public.

Location: Stockholm is located on Sweden's south-central east coast, where Lake Mälaren meets the Baltic Sea.
