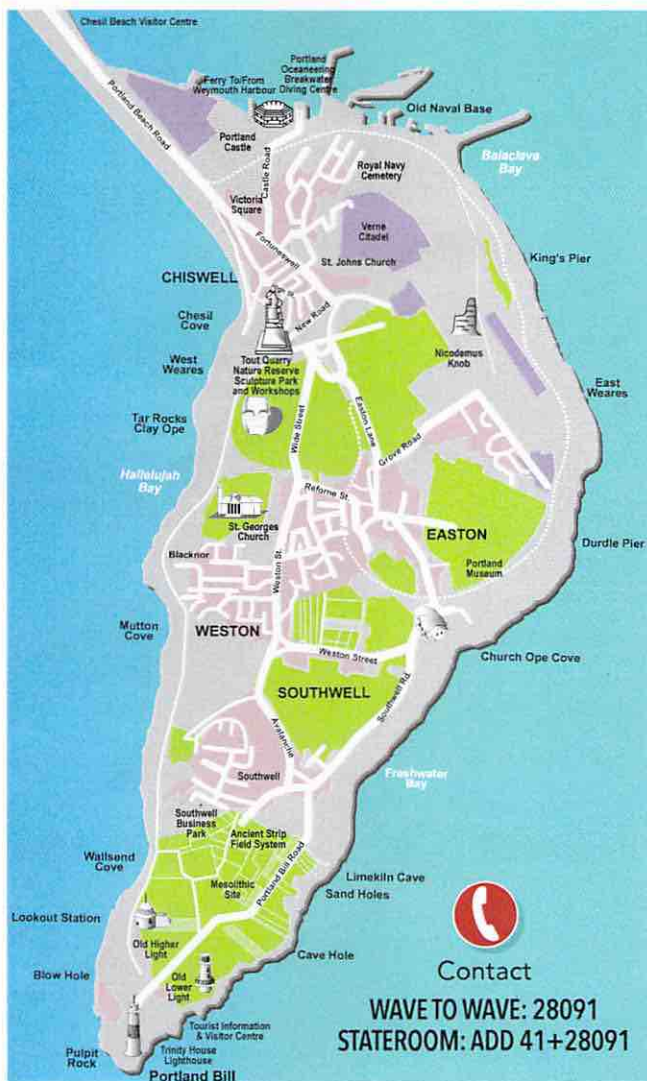

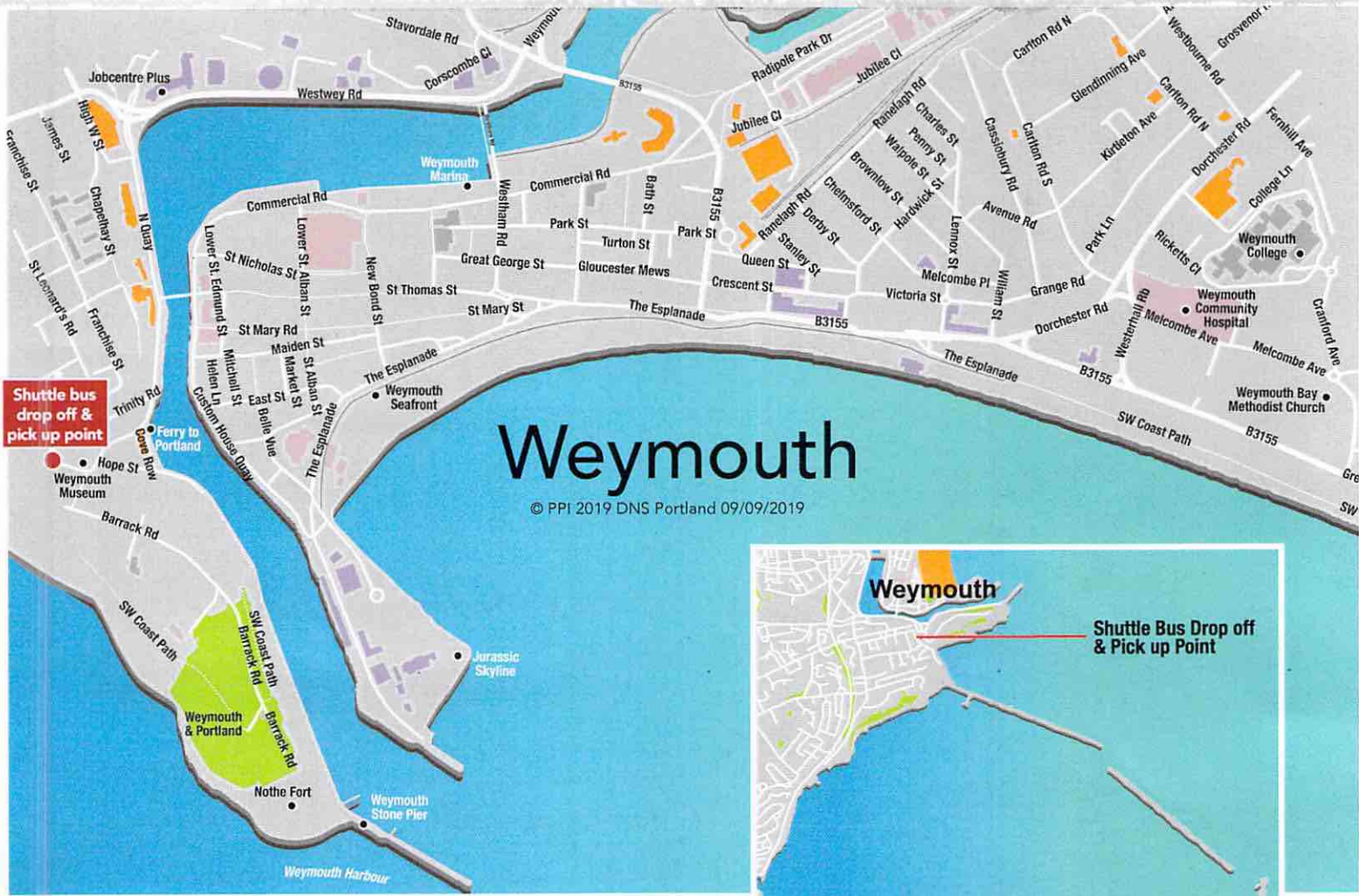

Travel Safety Tips

While you will find many great experiences ashore, please remain vigilant about your personal safety and the safety of your belongings. As in any tourist destination, you'll want to take some basic precautions to make the most of your time ashore.

- Be aware of your surroundings at all times. Obey local traffic and pedestrian laws and signage. Please use crosswalks and mind the traffic signals or crossing guards if present. Avoid short cuts, narrow alleys and poorly lit streets.
- Avoid wandering from the main shopping and tourist areas into unfamiliar territory. If venturing out independently, have a plan, use only licensed taxi operators.
- Identity/Credit Card theft can occur anywhere. Please remain vigilant in monitoring the safe keeping of your personal information.
- Leave valuables in your room safe and avoid carrying large amounts of cash. Exercise caution when using ATMs. Cameras and handbags should be carried close to your body or concealed out of sight.
- Leave air transportation tickets and other travel documents in your room safe. When going ashore, each adult is required to carry a government-issued photo ID. – Note: Some ports may require Guests to carry passports ashore.
- Most crimes are easier to commit in dark unlit areas. When going ashore at night, please be extra vigilant about your personal safety.
- All Guests (including children) who wish to disembark the ship are required to present their Key To The World card at the gangway. A photo ID is also required for those Guests who are 18 years of age or older. Guest under the age of 18 are required to have a parent, guardian or other responsible adult sign an authorization form at the Guest Services desk if they wish to go ashore unaccompanied or with any adult from another stateroom.

Please remember that while in a foreign country, you are subject to its laws.



PORTLAND OVERVIEW

Historically the original harbor was formed by the protection offered by the south coast of England, Chesil Beach and the Isle of Portland. Thus giving safe haven from bad weather to ships from all directions except the east. The natural shelter was used by ships for centuries and the Romans valued the area's strategic importance.

Portland Harbor is located beside the Isle of Portland, off Dorset, on the south coast of England. When completed in 1872 its surface area made it the largest man-made harbor in the world and it is still the third largest today.

The Harbor was sold off by the Royal Navy in 1996 allowing it to be used as both a center for water sports and as a service facility for Channel shipping. Portland Port Ltd, formed in December 1994. The port's aim was of developing ship repair as well as harbor leisure and tourism potential.

The commercial port has expanded since its initial establishment; the Britannia Passenger Terminal was opened by HRH Prince Philip on July 14 1999. In April 2000 the contract was signed for a new bunkering jetty and berth, which came into service in 2005.

Commercial activities on the water include specialist diving services for vessels and repairs and maintenance as well as a bunkering (fueling) station. The port is used by all nature of vessels from commercial ships such as bulkers, tankers, container carriers' car carriers, survey and Reefers etc. to British and foreign naval vessels. Commercial activities on the land of the dock estate include fuel storage, natural gas storage, several engineering facilities and a shell fish specialist.

The port also sees various cruise ship calls bringing visitors to the Dorset area. The Britannia Cruise Terminal, which was opened in July 1999 and again refurbished in 2005 has seen the likes of major cruise ships and use it as a start point for excursions in the wider Dorset region as well as beyond. In recent years the number of cruise ship calls have increased at the port.
